




THE SPRING OUTING!



30 DAYS OF TROUT by A.Kitson

I was fortunate enough to do business with the late Rusty Gates. Over the years, Rusty gave me A LOT of advice on the art of fly fishing, and I regret not taking better notes.

I once asked Rusty when his favorite time of the year to fish, and without hesitation, he said that everyone should fish as much as possible from May 15 to June 15. Over the past several years, I have taken Rusty's advice...With great results!

If you like to fish for trout in small streams (and if you don't, why are you reading this rag??) do yourself a favor and get out and fish the local waters this late spring! The recent colder than usual weather is setting this "30 Days of Trout" up to be outstanding... And I can't wait.

One other piece of advice... Keep a journal. A detailed journal... Not just "I caught an 8" brown on a size 16 Adams" but what was the weather doing, what was the temperature, what was the water level and clarity? I even like to look at the plant life and make notes of what stages they are in.

One more thing, don't stop fishing when it get's dark. Some of the best hatches of the night occur just after dusk, and with our wonderful time change, you can easily fish until 10:30 or all night with a good moon!

Now... Get out there and fish... and drop me a line and let me know how you do!! Maybe it will make it into *The Loop!* Hope to see you out there!
