MEETINGS - OUTINGS - FLY TYING



Education

Activities



SO MANY SPECIES

The St. Joseph River Valley offers some of the best freshwater fishing in the midwest. And since you can fish all year round, there's always an excuse to grab your fly rod and head for the water! Whether you want to big water fish for Steelhead, Coho, or Chinook Salmonon Lake Michigan tributaries, or wade into a clear stream for brown trout, the challenge will lure you in again and again. Other catches include smallmouth bass, walleye, pike, catfish, crappie, carp, bass and muskies.



RIVERS AND STREAMS

St. Joe River: The St. Joe River is one of the most versatile rivers you will find. Expect to find an abundance of Steelhead and Salmon in the spring and fall. In the summer months, the Joe becomes a top notch Smallmouth fishery. There are many wadable sections with easy access through out the South Bend area, including downtown!

Dowagiac River: Starting at the Pucker Street Dam and flowing south until she dumps into the Joe, Dowagiac River is a fast moving thrill ride that can produce trophy fish. While there are wading opportunities, this stretch is a great half day float with easy access getting in and out. North of the dam offers anglers a more mellow wade with an abundance of big browns.

Dowagiac Creek: Nestled just to the east of the Dowagiac River, Dowagiac Creek is a beautiful little spring creek, full of beautiful trout; perfect for beginners as well as seasoned anglers. Once you fish this charming stream, you will be back!

Little Elkhart River: This stream can be found in the Amish country of northern Indiana, near Middlebury. "The Little E" offer miles of catch and release trout fishing, as well as great food and shopping nearby. There are many public access point with easy wading. This is quickly becoming the finest trout water in Indiana.

Other Streams: Also check out: Cobus Creek, Elkhart River, The Brandywine, Trail Creek, The Galien...or come to a meeting and find out where the really good fishing is!!
